



LEGEND 60K Groomed Nordic Ski Trails: Classic & C-Skiing & Skate Skiing
100 Miles Groomed Multi-Use Winter Trails

• Use a topo map for navigation. • Ice conditions can exist. • Distances are approximated in kms. • Trails shown are general locations and may change due to snow conditions.

- 7 Yamaguchi Park.** From downtown, go south on Hot Springs Blvd past Town Hall. Right on Apache St, left on S 5th St and 2 blocks to parking on left. Flat conditions, with the gazebo alongside the river providing a great family area and a perfect lunch-time workout spot.
- 8 Reservoir Hill.** NOT Recommended for Beginners due to slope & need for speed control. From downtown, go south on Hot Springs Blvd, left on San Juan St, public parking on left. Walk up hill to trailhead. (Beginners try Yamaguchi Park.)
- 9 Williams Creek Reservoir.** Williams Creek Reservoir. North on Piedra Rd (CR 600) then 631) 22 mi. Turn right on Williams Creek Rd (CR 640), parking on the right. Multi-use area. Fairly flat, good for beginners, excellent views. Not groomed.
- 10 Turkey Springs Trails.** North on Piedra Rd (CR 600) 0.3 mi. Go 1/2 mi beyond N Pagosa junction & cross cattle guard. Parking is on the left. You may encounter snowmobiles on some trails. 15K Groomed multi-use area by Trail Blazer Snowmobile Club. Groomed Fat Bike trails.

- 11 Fourmile Road (FS 645) and E Plumtaw Rd (FS 634).** From downtown, north onto Levels St, immediate left onto N 5th St, becomes Fourmile Rd (CR 405). Go 6.5 mi. to trailhead. Roadside parking. Some commercial snowmobile operations. Connect with McManus/E Toner trail-head. 36K groomed by Trail Blazer Snowmobile Club.
- 12 Jackson Mountain (FS 037).** 7 miles NE on Hwy 160. Park on shoulder. Popular snowmobile area. Some commercial snowmobile operations. Intermediate, 13K.
- 13 East Fork Trail (FS 667).** Enjoyable route for one or several miles. Parallels the East Fork of the San Juan River. 8 miles to the historic Silver Falls Guard Station. Please stay on road as it passes thru private property. This area sees significant snowmobile use. Groomed occasionally by the Wolf Creek Trail Blazers snowmobile club which, when groomed, can provide a quality distance ski. 23K.
- 14 Wolf Creek Rd (FS 725).** 20.8 mi NE on Hwy 160. Three forest access points along approximately three miles of Hwy 160 with some fairly open, moderate terrain in this area. Views are spectacular. Groomed for multi-use. Popular snowmobile area. Skiers typically use Lobo Overlook. Increased avalanche potential. 11K.
- 15 Wolf Creek Pass/Lobo Overlook.** 23 miles northeast on Hwy 160 to the pass. South side of Hwy 160 is multi-use area with some commercial snowmobile operations. Go 1/2 mi further east to Lobo Overlook for non-motorized areas (except on Forest Rd). Parking on north side of Hwy. A variety of terrain can be accessed from this point. WolfCreek Avalanche School provides a free beacon practice park here also. Increased avalanche potential. Backcountry terrain. Intermediate to Advanced. Groomed by Wolf Creek Ski Area.
- 16 McManus Rd (FS 633)- E Toner (FS 637) - W Plumtaw.** From Hwy 160, 11.5 miles north on Piedra Rd, then 2 miles on McManus Road to end of plowed road. Groomed periodically by Trail Blazer Snowmobile Club. Some commercial snowmobile operations.
